

"The First Emperor of China" videodisc is the first part of PROJECT EMPEROR-I, funded by the Humanities Project in Libraries, the National Endowment for the Humanities, with a matching grant from Simmons College and a hardware grant from Digital Equipment Corporation.

The project applies the latest in videodisc technology in order to present and interpret a major historical/archaeological period of China's past. The First Emperor, Qin Shi Huang Di's terracotta army stands guard over his tomb in Xian, China. This army and other cultural aspects captured on the disc make that period of Chinese history (221-206 B.C.) come alive for the general public.

Dr. Chen's program will demonstrate the interactive videodisc and present background on the production and applications as well as the research decisions and challenges leading to its existence.
